Requirements:

Experience with quantitative (e.g., experiments, data analysis with R) and/or qualitative (e.g., interviews) methods is of advantage. Very good English language skills are necessary.

The duration of the internship is negotiable, but should be at least one month full-time. The internship is not remunerated, but can be credited as a mandatory internship (e.g., in the context of your psychology degree). Internships can be combined with Bachelor or Master thesis projects.
